Introduction

This National Security Statement is submitted in support of the Home Office's planning application for the expansion of the Campsfield Immigration Removal Centre (IRC) under the Crown Development planning route. The Campsfield site forms a vital part of the UK's secure immigration detention estate, providing essential capacity to detain and manage individuals who may pose risks to national security, public protection, or the integrity of the UK's borders.

The purpose of this National Security Statement is to:

- Set out the **national security significance** of Campsfield IRC and its proposed expansion.
- Explain that certain submitted planning documents contain **sensitive information** that cannot be disclosed publicly and, where they are released into the public domain, appropriate redactions will be present.
- Set out the justification for issuing a Direction where it is necessary to prevent the publication of specific materials that would pose unacceptable risks. These risks may include the compromise of national security, undermining operational processes, exposing commercially sensitive information or harming the wider public interest.

National Security Statement

Strategic Purpose of Campsfield IRC in National Security

Campsfield IRC is a government facility supporting the secure management and detention of individuals subject to immigration control, including those who may pose heightened risk, such as:

- Foreign National Offenders (FNOs) who present criminality-related risks.
- Individuals with indicators of serious criminality or security concerns.
- Failed asylum seekers and illegal migrants without leave to remain in the UK.

The secure and continued operation of Campsfield IRC is a core component of border integrity and national security. Its functions directly support Government priorities on immigration enforcement and enforced returns by:

- Reducing the risk of individuals absconding where they present public protection or national security risks.
- Providing the detention capacity required to progress individuals with no right to remain through the returns process, including foreign national offenders and failed asylum seekers.
- Maintaining resilience and surge capacity across the detention estate to support increased immigration enforcement activity and the timely delivery of lawful removals.
- Enabling the Home Office to carry out lawful removals of individuals with no right to remain in the UK, including those assessed as posing higher levels of harm.

The expansion of Campsfield IRC will deliver up to 240 additional bedspaces, modernised secure facilities and enhanced operational infrastructure, which is required to ensure the continued efficiency and resilience of these critical national security functions.

Sensitivity and Security Context

Campsfield IRC operates within a nationally sensitive environment, alongside other major immigration detention and asylum facilities. These sites are frequently the focus of:

- Large-scale protests and demonstrations.
- Organised attempts to obtain or disseminate sensitive operational information, including on online platforms.

- Violent incidents: including the 2022 firebomb attack at Western Jet Foil.

The disclosure of detailed information about internal building layouts, security systems or operational flows at Campsfield IRC would present a significant security risk. The mosaic theory, established in intelligence and national security practice, shows that adversaries can combine small fragments of information – including both publicly available data and any sensitive details inadvertently released through the planning process – to build a clear picture of operational capabilities or vulnerabilities.

It is therefore essential that sensitive operational and security information is not published as part of the planning application process to remove any potential for hostile actors to identify weaknesses and plan disruptive harmful activity.

Documents Requiring Non-Disclosure

In line with the [Government Security Classification Policy \(2024\)](#) and the [Town and Country Planning \(Crown Development Applications\) \(Procedure and Written Representations\) Order 2025](#), certain documents submitted in support of this planning application must be withheld from publication.

These include:

Site Layouts and Technical Plans

Including materials showing:

- Detailed building configurations and internal plans.
- Locations of secure zones and controlled areas.
- Perimeter integrity.
- Vehicle access routes and staff/operational circulation.

Such information could aid attempts to breach security or coordinate disruption.

Security Systems and Measures

Including:

- CCTV locations and surveillance coverage.
- Alarm, detection and intrusion prevention systems.
- Access control arrangements.

Public release would severely compromise site security, which would lead to unmanageable operational risks.

Images, Visualisations and Mapping Material

Including photographs, drone imagery or photomontages that show:

- External secure infrastructure or buffer zones.
- Spatial layouts that expose operational workflows or purposes.
- Potential ingress and egress points.

Visual materials are particularly susceptible to mosaic-effect risks, as individual images can be combined with other information to reveal sensitive operational details.

Operational Process and Procedures

Including documentation relating to:

- Resident flows and security screening processes.
- Staff deployment, shift patterns or staffing levels and areas of responsibility.
- Coordination with the Home Office, Police and security partners.
- Scheduled routines or predictable movement patterns.

Disclosure could significantly compromise staff safety, operational resilience and public protection.

Financially and Commercially Sensitive Information

Certain documents within the planning application contain financially and commercially sensitive information, and procurement-related information. These include:

- Commercial contracts, pricing structures or cost models.
- Procurement strategies, commercial risk assessments and delivery approaches.
- Information that could prejudice future procurement exercises or undermine commercial negotiations.

Disclosure of this information would:

- Undermine the Home Office's commercial position.
- Prejudice procurement activity and increase costs to the taxpayer.
- Reveal contractor-specific information subject to commercial confidentiality.
- Potentially expose sensitive operational or security-related cost structures.

For these reasons, financially and commercially sensitive documentation must be treated as confidential and withheld from publication to protect commercial integrity and security-related interests.

Legal Basis to Withhold Relevant Information

The Home Office seeks a Direction to prevent disclosure of sensitive information on the following grounds:

1. National Security Grounds

[Section 24 of the Freedom of Information Act \(Safeguarding National Security\)](#) permits information to be withheld where disclosure could increase vulnerability to national security threats, even where there is no immediate or direct evidence of harm.

Key considerations include:

- The need to protect secure Government facilities and other potential targets from exploitation.
- The risk that the release of sensitive operational, physical or procedural information may assist hostile actors.

2. Commercial and Financial Grounds

[Section 43 of the Freedom of Information Act \(Commercial Interests\)](#) permits information to be withheld where disclosure would prejudice commercial interests of the Home Office or its contractors.

Key considerations include:

- The risk that releasing commercially sensitive or financially confidential information could distort procurement or undermine fair competition.
- The potential that disclosure could weaken the Home Office's commercial position, exposing it to avoidable financial risk or disadvantaging ongoing or future commercial negotiations.

3. Public Interest Grounds

The public interest test, under the Freedom of Information Act, requires a careful balance between promoting transparency and preventing harm that could arise from disclosure. In this case, the balance of public interest favours withholding information, as releasing it would risk compromising safety, security or effectiveness of decision-making.

Key considerations include:

- The need to avoid increasing risks to national security, commercial integrity, operational safety or community cohesion.

- The fact that disclosure of sensitive material would not meaningfully enhance public understanding of planning impacts, yet would materially heighten risks to individuals, operations and wider public protection efforts.

This Direction enables the Secretary of State to consider all information in full, while preventing publication where disclosure would compromise national security or public interest.

National Security Rationale

Failure to deliver the Campsfield IRC expansion would have serious national security consequences, including:

- **Insufficient detention capacity**, limiting the Home Office's ability to hold individuals posing risks to the public or to national security.
- **Reduced ability to carry out lawful removals** of individuals with no right to remain in the UK, including those assessed as presenting higher levels of harm.
- **Increased pressures across the detention estate**, increasing the risk of absconding, overstays, and operational instability.
- **Reduced resilience during operational surges**, such as major enforcement operations or periods of heightened demand for detention capacity required to deliver lawful removals.

The Campsfield IRC expansion is essential to maintaining effective immigration enforcement, national security and public protection.

Consultation and Engagement

The Home Office has undertaken structured engagement with:

- Local authorities and planning leads.
- Emergency services.
- Statutory environmental and heritage consultees.
- Relevant operational agencies.

Engagement has been carefully managed to ensure that:

- Sensitive or security-relevant information is shared only on a confidential basis with those who have a genuine need to access it.
- Public consultation was conducted without disclosing operational or security details that could compromise national security or community cohesion.

This approach provides transparency where appropriate, while safeguarding essential operational and security requirements.

Public Interest and Community Cohesion

Immigration facilities are politically and socially sensitive. Disclosure of sensitive information could:

- Increase the likelihood of protests, disorder or targeted activity.
- Heighten local tensions during a period of increased national protest activity.
- Risk the safety of staff, residents and local communities.
- Undermine confidence in the Government's management of migration and enforcement.

For these reasons, withholding sensitive information is essential to safeguarding the public interest, maintaining community cohesion and protecting the safety of all those affected.

Conclusion

The Campsfield IRC expansion is a nationally significant project which is essential to:

- Maintain secure and effective immigration enforcement.
- Support national security objectives.
- Increase capacity for the enforced removal of Foreign National Offenders (FNOs) and other individuals with no leave to remain in the UK.
- Ensure operational resilience during periods of heightened operational demand for detention capacity to support immigration enforcement and lawful removals.
- Uphold public safety and border security.

Given the sensitivity of the materials submitted and the operational risks that would arise for their disclosure, the Home Office formally requests that the Planning Inspectorate issue a Direction under the Crown Development process to prevent the publication of the identified sensitive documents – see Annex A. This measure is necessary to ensure that all required information can be considered in full, while safeguarding national security, maintaining operational integrity and protecting the public.
