SEVINGTON CCTV – APPLICANT’S SUMMARY OF KEY POINTS

1. CCTV is used at the Site to maintain its safety and security.
2. CCTV facilities are operated by Sodexo.
3. Sodexo has summarised the position on their controls around CCTV use:

“To confirm, only those with CCTV licences have access to view live cameras and recorded images. As part of this legal requirement team members are trained on privacy law. Our team members CCTV licences are issued by the SIA and only authorised training providers are used. CCTV licences are valid 3 years and our teams always follow the best practice guidelines. The training and law states that: Team members are not authorised to direct the cameras into the public domain (defined as outside of the monitoring area aka: Sevington IBF), unless they are investigating and/or monitoring an incident. CCTV operators are not allowed to view live or recorded images in the public domain but we also have a duty of care towards the public.”

4. The example given at the site visit of an incident where CCTV cameras might be directed into the public domain was if smoke suggesting a hazardous fire were to be observed rising from a neighbour’s house and the use of the CCTV cameras to assist with establishing a neighbour’s welfare. If it became apparent that the fire was in fact the neighbour burning rubbish in their garden, then cameras would simply be turned back to the Site.
